FOREWARD FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Hope Spring for All Nations (HSFAN) is a woman-led Non-Governmental Organization committed

to empowering communities in the South West Region of Cameroon through comprehensive

programs focused on economic development, food security, education, gender-based violence

(GBV) prevention, and overall human rights protection. Established with the mission to uplift the

most vulnerable populations, HSFAN works to create sustainable change across two primary

divisions: Kupe-Muanenguba and Fako.

In 2024, HSFAN successfully implemented 11 impactful projects, directly benefiting 2,589

individuals from various backgrounds and addressing urgent needs across multiple sectors. The

organization's programmatic areas—Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH), Education, Child

Protection, Health, Emergency Support, GBV, and Women's Empowerment—were central to

these efforts. The initiatives targeted critical areas of vulnerability and contributed to improving

the living conditions of displaced individuals, returnees, refugees, and host community members.

Key Achievements and Impact:

The projects implemented in 2024 focused on providing life-saving support and resilience-

building activities, especially for populations affected by the ongoing crisis in the region. A

notable proportion of beneficiaries were Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs), who made up the

majority (1,460 individuals), followed by 750 Returnees, 9 Refugees, and 370 members of the

Host Community.






Figure 1: Projects 2023 vs 2024

In 2024, HSFAN had a total of 11 projects implemented compared to 2 projects registered in 2023. New projects were implemented across four departments as shown below (Figure 1).

The Departments of HSFAN reached and supported a total of 2,589 vulnerable persons within vulnerable communities spread across 1 region of Cameroon in 2024 (Figure 5). Education department reached 1,682 people with educational materials, WASH department reached 590 construction of water stand and promotion hygiene, sanitation and health activities, economic

security department reached 282 while with empowerment activities to alleviate poverty, agriculture department reached 35 people with sustainable agriculture activity picture




Figure 3: Number of persons reached through HSFAN's programmatic arms.

3.4 ORGANIZATIONAL COVERAGE

In 2024, **HSFAN** implemented projects in the **South West Region** of Cameroon, specifically in the **Kupe Muanenguba** and **Fako** divisions. The **education department** had the widest coverage, reaching **2,589** beneficiaries across various projects in the region. The **economic empowerment department** primarily operated in the South West region, focusing on activities related to women and youth empowerment to alleviate poverty. The **WASH department**, **education**, and **agriculture** also focused on interventions in these two divisions, particularly addressing the needs of vulnerable populations such as internally displaced persons (IDPs) and the elderly.



In 2024, Hope Spring for All Nations (HSFAN) significantly strengthened its collaborations with key stakeholders at both the regional and sub-regional levels, enhancing its ability to implement impactful interventions across its core programmatic areas. Central to these efforts was the

Economic Security Department, which led the organization's initiatives aimed at empowering vulnerable populations, particularly women and internally displaced persons (IDPs). By fostering these strategic partnerships, HSFAN successfully mobilized a diverse array of actors to promote sustainable change and address the needs of the most marginalized communities.

At the regional level, HSFAN worked closely with the Regional Delegation of Women's Empowerment and the Family, a partnership that enhanced the organization's outreach and capacity to deliver skill development and empowerment programs for women. This collaboration allowed for the creation of targeted initiatives that equipped women with the tools and knowledge necessary to improve their livelihoods and gain economic independence. Additionally, by aligning efforts with the regional delegation, HSFAN was able to ensure that its activities complemented broader regional policies on gender equality and women's empowerment, driving systemic change within the region.

HSFAN also worked in close partnership with regional medical officers to ensure healthcare access for vulnerable populations. These collaborations focused on improving healthcare delivery, especially for IDPs, women, and children, by facilitating access to essential medical services, including reproductive health care, vaccinations, and trauma care. By coordinating with local health authorities, HSFAN was able to provide comprehensive, timely support to communities in need, mitigating the health risks exacerbated by displacement and conflict.

At the sub-regional level, HSFAN's efforts expanded through partnerships with district medical offices, local councils, and traditional leaders. These collaborations were pivotal in fostering grassroots initiatives and ensuring that responses were tailored to the specific needs of local communities. Working closely with district medical offices, HSFAN contributed to enhancing healthcare access and awareness campaigns, especially around WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) issues that have a direct impact on public health. By collaborating with local councils and traditional leaders, the organization leveraged existing community structures to ensure that interventions were culturally relevant and widely accepted by the population.

Community-based organizations (CBOs) also played a vital role in supporting HSFAN's work.

These local organizations were key partners in the delivery of services and implementation of

development programs, particularly in rural and hard-to-reach areas. CBOs helped to ensure that

HSFAN's interventions were aligned with community priorities and that they had the local

knowledge necessary to address the unique challenges facing vulnerable groups. By working in

close coordination with these grassroots entities, HSFAN was able to deliver sustainable

development outcomes that were both impactful and rooted in local realities.

Through these multi-tiered partnerships, HSFAN was able to make significant strides in its

programmatic areas, including agriculture, education, WASH, and economic security. In

agriculture, for example, the organization collaborated with local agricultural experts and

farmers' associations to implement initiatives that enhanced food security and promoted

sustainable farming practices. In education, HSFAN worked with local education authorities to

provide training for teachers and support for students, particularly those from vulnerable

backgrounds. The organization's WASH programs, which focused on improving access to clean

water and sanitation facilities, benefited from strong partnerships with local health and

environmental agencies to ensure long-term, sustainable impact.

Overall, the collaborative efforts in 2024 allowed HSFAN to align its programs with national goals

and strategies for sustainable development. By working alongside government agencies, local

authorities, and community-based organizations, HSFAN was able to contribute to the

achievement of national and international development objectives, particularly those set out by

the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). These collaborations not only

enhanced the effectiveness of HSFAN's interventions but also ensured that the organization's

work was integrated into broader development frameworks, contributing to long-term systemic

change and resilience-building in the South West Region of Cameroon.



Hope Spring for All Nations (HSFAN) supported 2,589 vulnerable persons in communities across Kupe Muanenguba and Fako Divisions in the South West Region of Cameroon. The programmatic arms of HSFAN implemented activities across WASH/Health, Agriculture, Education, and Economic Security, aimed at addressing urgent community needs and sustainable development (Figure 5).

A total of 12 capacity-building projects were conducted to strengthen community-based structures and empower vulnerable populations. The WASH Department conducted the highest number of interventions (5 sessions), followed by Education (3 sessions), Economic Security (3 sessions) and agriculture with 1 session.



3.7 DEPARTMENTAL ACHIEVEMENT

3.7.1 HSFAN's Health and WASH Department Collaborative Efforts in 2024

The **Health Department**, working in close collaboration with the **WASH Department**, reached a total of **590 individuals** in Fako **Division** in the South West Region of Cameroon. Activities

primarily focused on addressing waterborne diseases, as well as providing sugar level testing and

blood pressure monitoring services to vulnerable populations.

Out of this total:

• 300 individuals benefited from waterborne disease prevention initiatives, including

sensitization campaigns on clean water access and hygiene practices.

• 190 individuals received blood pressure checks and education on hypertension

management.

100 individuals were supported through sugar level testing services, aimed at early

detection and prevention of diabetes-related complications.

These health initiatives were part of an integrated approach to improve overall community well-

being, especially in rural areas affected by poor access to healthcare and clean water. By

combining efforts with the WASH Department, the Health Department ensured that health

services were not only delivered but complemented by essential hygiene and sanitation

measures to promote long-term impact.

This collaborative strategy aligns with HSFAN's mission to address interconnected challenges in

vulnerable communities and reflects its commitment to achieving the UN Sustainable

Development Goals of good health and well-being (SDG 3) and clean water and sanitation (SDG

6).

The Economic Security Department of HSFAN provided support to 282 vulnerable persons in the South West Region of Cameroon through various economic empowerment initiatives aimed at improving self-reliance and economic stability.

The department's efforts focused on:

 Skill Development Programs: Training 282 beneficiaries, including women and youths, in practical skills tailored to enhance their income-generating potential.

The **Education Department** of HSFAN reached a total of **1,023 vulnerable persons** across the South West Region of Cameroon. The department focused on addressing barriers to education by supporting underserved children and promoting equitable access to quality learning opportunities.

Key activities included:

- **Distribution of Educational Materials:** Essential school supplies, such as books, pens, and pencils, were distributed to schoolchildren to improve learning outcomes.
- Educational Awareness Campaigns: Engaging activities to raise awareness about the importance of education and to celebrate events such as the International Day of Education and the International Day of the Girl Child.
- **Support for Vulnerable Children:** Special attention was given to children from displaced and impoverished families, ensuring that they had the resources needed to pursue education.

Highlights of project implemented by the Education Department

3.7.4 HSFAN's Agriculture Department in 2024

The **Agriculture Department** of HSFAN worked towards promoting sustainable agricultural practices to enhance food security and resilience among vulnerable communities in the South West Region. In 2024, the department reached **35 beneficiaries** through targeted programs aimed at improving agricultural productivity and sustainability.

Key initiatives included:

- **Integrated Pest Management Training:** Educating farmers on sustainable methods to control pests and improve crop yields.

6. **Functional Allocation of Expenses:** The costs of providing the various programs and other activities have been detailed on a functional basis in the Expenditures and sources of funds spreadsheet, annex 3 A & B

7. **Local Currency Translation:** The funds are budgeted and expended in XAF BEAC; the functional currency used in the preparation of the annual financial statements for the organization. All balance sheet, income statement and supplementary annexes reported in local currencies at year end have been translated to XAF BEAC using the exchange rate of XAF 550 / USD \$ 1 in effect at date of receipts.

8. **Use of Estimate:** The preparation of financial statements in conformity with OHADA accounting principles accepted in Cameroon and its member states requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Accordingly, if actual results differ from those estimates, exchange gains or losses are recorded thus.

9. **Contribution in Kind:** The organization receives a significant amount of donated time from volunteers on support of its programs and operations. Because no objective basis is available to measure the value of such time, no amount has been recorded in the accompanying financial statements for donated time by volunteers.

10. **Partnership Ties**: HSFAN partners are society opinion leaders, the Government of Cameroon and other non-governmental institutions. She also works in collaboration with NGO networks within the centre region of Cameroon and Africa.

11. **Economy Dependency:** HSFAN's fund revenue for the year ended 31st December, 2024 was derived as follows: 8% from own generated income, 80% from international donors, and 12% as
